

The Divine Nature Of Jesus Christ from John Chapter 1

1:1: In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

1:14: The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

1:17: For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ.

The Divine Nature Of Jesus Christ From John Chapter 13

- 1. He manifested God's Devine Love:
- It was just before the Passover Feast. Jesus knew that the time had come for him to leave this world and go to the Father.
- Having loved his own who were in the world, he now showed them the full extent of his love. (John 13:1)
- 2. He manifested God's Divine Glory:
- Now is the Son of Man glorified and God is glorified in him. If God is glorified in him, God will glorify the Son in himself, and will glorify him at once.

(John 13:31-32)

Three Characteristics of Jesus' Love from John Chapter 13

1. Love continues to the full (John 13:1):

Having loved his own who were in the world, he now showed them the full extent of his love.

2. Love to serve as a servant (John 13:14):
Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet.

3. Love to forgive wrong doings (John 13:38)
I tell you the truth, before the rooster crows, you will disown me three times.

You do not realize now what I am doing, but later you will understand.

Unless I wash you, you have no part with me.



Jesus was referring to His cross in the future. The cross of Jesus is the key to unlock all the power for the New Command.
