## Philips Sonicare ProtectiveClean 5100



The Philips Sonicare ProtectiveClean 5100 Gum Health is among the best overall electric toothbrushes in this roundup, and it offers the longest battery life of any model we tested. It's also fairly affordable and it's an appealing choice for people who already use their smartphone in the shower or who have kids who use theirs.

The 5100's waterproof switches and charging base make it a good choice for folks who keep their toothbrush near the shower or tub, but keep in mind that the brush head is disposable, so you'll need to purchase a replacement every so often. (The 5100 is an excellent alternative to the Oral-B iO Series 9 if you want a cordless model.)

The 5100's biggest advantage is that it pairs with an app called Sonicare Connected, which encourages you to keep brushing for 2 minutes at a time, and the 5100 vibrates to let you know when you've reached the end of 2 minutes. The app keeps track of your daily brushing habits, and it encourages flossing as well. The app also lets you track your brushing in real time, and it notes your brushing history over time, which can help you determine how often you're reaching for the toothbrush. (The 5100 is compatible with both Apple and Android devices.)

The 5100 has the usual Sonicare features, such as the pressure sensor and

timers, and it also has the standard array of brushes to suit a variety of needs.

## Philips Sonicare ProtectiveClean 5300

The Philips Sonicare ProtectiveClean 5300 Rechargeable Electric Power Toothbrush is well-constructed, easy to use, and effective. It has a pressure sensor, which our testers liked, and it shoots out a powerful, 40-second burst of sonic vibrations.

The brush head is simple to use and snaps on and off. Depending on your dental health goals, you can choose one of four modes, including "white" mode. The toothbrush has three levels of intensity: low, medium, and high. It also has a very handy two-minute timer, which reminds you when to brush each quadrant of your mouth, and a quadrant-by-quadrant display to show you how you're progressing.

This toothbrush comes in one color, black, and uses a lithium-ion battery. The charger is USB. The batteries charge fully in less than two hours. The toothbrush comes with two brush heads, so the battery will last you two weeks. The brush heads are more expensive than other brush heads, but our testers said these products lasted longer than other brushes.

## Philips Sonicare ProtectiveClean 6100



The Philips Sonicare ProtectiveClean 6100 is an excellent electric toothbrush for

anyone who wants a top-of-the-line brush but isn't ready to spend hundreds of dollars for it. It performs as well as or better than the high-end, more expensive Philips Sonicare model we previously recommended.

The ProtectiveClean offers a lot of the same features as the top-of-the-line Philips Sonicare DiamondClean 9300, including similar brushing modes and timers. The ProtectiveClean 6100 also has all the same extras you'll find on Philips Sonicare's premium models: a pressure sensor, an optional travel case, and a user-replaceable battery. It's comfortable to hold and use, and it gives the same satisfying cleaning action as the more expensive model.

The ProtectiveClean 6100 also achieves excellent results in all the categories in which we test electric toothbrushes. The Sonicare brush heads are expensive, but most dentists and hygienists agree that they're better than their usual soft-bristle replacements. Whichever model you choose, you generally should replace brush heads after two to three months.

## Philips Sonicare ProtectiveClean 6500



The Philips Sonicare ProtectiveClean 6500 Rechargeable Electric Power Toothbrush with Charging Travel Case and Extra Brush Head easily wins our Editors' Choice award. Our top pick is versatile, easy-to-use, and portable—and if that's not enough, it's also rechargeable.

It earned a score of 92 in our recent lab testing, besting several manual and

power toothbrushes that cost twice as much. The Sonicare is on par with a manual toothbrush in how effective it is at removing plaque, and it excels at removing stains. We also liked the brush's pressure sensor, which gently pulses to alert users when they're brushing too hard, and its two-minute timer, which signals when two minutes have passed and when it's time to spit or stop.

The brush has three different brushing modes: Clean, White, and Gum Care. The brush is also easy to clean, and replacing the brush head is easy.
