From the Pastor:

After eight years as the leader of the free world, president Ronald Reagan had seen great changes. Among other achievements, he'd survived an assassination attempt, led his country out of a recession, and played a key role in the demolition of the Soviet socialist regime in Europe. On January 11, 1989, President Ronald Reagan gave his farewell address to the nation from the Oval Office in the White House. From that room in our nation's capital—the epicenter of

world power—Reagan reflected upon the location of real, lasting, and meaningful change. He said this:

"All great change in America begins at the dinner table."

Now, politicians are famous for saying things they don't mean, but Reagan nailed something profoundly true here. He saw that deep, lasting change comes through the relationships built by the repeated, shared experience of family supper. Presidents and their administrations come and go; programs and empires rise and fall, and we're largely unchanged as a result. But at the dinner table, we learn to be who we are and how to be with others. We learn to get along and share. We receive the energy we need to keep living. As kids, it's where we learn to pray and use our manners. As adults, it's where we learn to be friends and husbands and wives and parents and providers and grateful guests.

As a toddler, you most likely learned to talk and read facial expressions and use your hands at the table. I don't remember what I had for breakfast two days ago, but I will always remember the big wooden table in my parents' dining room. I can see the scratches my siblings and I carved into the table with our forks and knives as we ate and bickered and grew up together. I can hear the table creak from my leaning on it or shifting it just a bit to the right to sweep under it. I left marks on that table, but that table also left marks on me.

What the Great Communicator observed in his speech was something the Great Physician understood deeply; it's how he designed us to live. All four of the Gospels describe Jesus "at the table" with his disciples or other guests, and in those moments he both cuts the self-righteous to the heart and pours out grace to those in need of it. One of the two acts of worship that Jesus explicitly commands us to observe as a group together is what we call the Lord's Supper. That's why we have a dinner table under the pulpit in the sanctuary, to celebrate the last communal activity of Jesus before he was crucified. Jesus gave us the Lord's Table as the place where we encounter great change through the Gospel. In the bread and wine we are confronted with the death and resurrection of Jesus in our place. We are moved to continual repentance and faith in Jesus, and we are reminded of our place in the family of God. The Lord's Table also reminds us of God's aim to be with his people, to share a great feast with them on that Last Day, at the "marriage supper of the Lamb" (Revelation 19:9). As ambassadors for Jesus and joint-heirs with him, it's now our job to invite people to that great

marriage supper, which anyone can receive by repenting of their sins and trusting in Jesus. Our unbelieving world needs that Gospel invitation. As a proof of its power, maybe that invitation can include an invitation to supper at your own table. After all, isn't that where all great change begins?






