PRIAM: Yes. It's most refreshing. Perhaps there is a man lurking behind that flaccid facade, after all/

PARIS: I would be obliged, father, if you would refrain from patronising me in front of the prisoner./

PRIAM: The prisoner ... that's it. One pathetic prisoner and he thinks he is Hercules! Success has gone to your head./

PARIS: Before you start sneering at the prisoner you should know that this is Diomedes ... If you look in the Greek Army Lists you'll see he's quite a catch./

VICKI: You succeeded beautifully,
thank you / Diomede!
