LORELAI and RORY are standing in the school supplies aisle of the market.

LORELAI

Shopping for school supplies. Parrrrr-taaay.

RORY

Nobody demanded that you come.

LORELAI

What, are you kidding? How often do you get to do things like this? I was thinking as long as we're going crazy, let's get some toilet paper and a plunger next.

RORY

I'll do this later.

LORELAI

I'm teasing. Come on. Pull out that list of yours.

Rory pulls a list out of her pocket.

RORY

Okay. Fine. I need legal pads.

LORELAI

Got it.

RORY

Tons of pens...

LORELAI

Right.

RORY

Some number two pencils, three highlighters, an eraser, a staple remover and a pee-chee folder.

LORELAI

You need three highlighters?

RORY

Yes.

1 CONTINUED:

LORELAI

Three.

RORY

Yes.

LORELAI

That seems like a very random number.

RORY

Three is not a random number.

LORELAI

I mean, how did you come up with that number?

RORY

One dries up, one gets lost, I've got one left.

LORELAI

You've thought this out.

RORY

Yes, I have.

LORELAI

What came first, the chicken or the egg?

RORY

Back to the list please.

LORELAI

Okay...

(grabs some pads)

Legal pads...

RORY

Those are purple.

LORELAI

So what? They're festive.

RORY

I can't have purple.

LORELAI

Yes, you can. They're on sale.

1 CONTINUED: (2)

RORY

I am going to a serious school now. I need serious paper.

LORELAI

Paper is paper.

RORY

Not at Chilton.

LORELAI

Okay.

She puts the purple pads back and gets the standard yellow ones.

LORELAI (cont'd)

Fine. Here's your serious paper.

RORY

Thank you.

LORELAI

And here are your somber highlighters, your maudlin pencils and your manic-depressive pens.

RORY

Mom...

LORELAI

Now, the erasers are on lithium so they may seem cheerful, but we actually caught them trying to shove themselves into the pencil sharpener earlier.

RORY

I'm going home now.

LORELAI

Oh, wait. We're going to stage an intervention with the neon postits. Make them give up their wacky crazy ways.

RORY

You are never coming shopping with me again.

Rory exits with Lorelai blathering on after her.

FADE OUT.

END OF TEASER

ACT ONE

FADE IN:

2 EXT. CHILTON - MORNING (DAY 2)

2

A bus pulls up. Rory gets off, loaded down on both sides with bags of books. She walks out of frame. A beat, then she walks back in frame without the bags. She gets back on the bus and gets off holding another couple of bags. She goes back out of frame. A beat, then she comes back into frame, gets back on the bus and emerges with a gym bag and her lunch. She walks out of frame. The bus closes the door and pulls away. We follow the bus off to reveal Rory, now completely loaded down with all of her bags, starting the long walk up the hill to school.

3 INT. CHILTON - CLASSROOM - DAY (DAY 2)

3

Rory sits along with the rest of the class, including PARIS, TRISTIN, MADELINE and LOUISE. The teacher, MAX MEDINA, good-looking, mid-thirties, is handing out papers.

MAX

Decent effort by most, good effort by some, exceptional effort by two. Miss Geller.

Paris smiles proudly as she takes her paper.

MAX (cont'd)

And Miss Grant.

He hands a paper back to Louise. Madeline pouts.

MAX (cont'd)

Take these home. Learn from your mistakes.

He hands Rory her paper. She opens it. It's a D. She looks at it, heartbroken.

MAX (cont'd)

Look at the large red circles around various parts of your paper as friendly reminders that to err is human. And that here at Chilton, we try to beat that humanity right out of you.

He looks at Rory and smiles. She still looks shell-shocked.

3 CONTINUED:

MAX (cont'd)
Okay, next up, the test. The
dreaded test. Shakespeare. The
man we've been droning on about
for the last three weeks finally
comes back to haunt us on Friday.
This is a big one, my friends.
Multiple choice, with an essay
section that will count for twenty
percent of your grade this semester.
Don't be fooled by my kind face
and charming personality. This
test will be hard and there will
be no make-ups.

The BELLS RINGS.

MAX (cont'd)
You will need to refer back to the study materials I gave to you at the beginning of the month, as well as to the extensive notes you've been taking. Off with you.

The class pours out. Rory is still staring at her paper. Paris, Madeline and Louise gather near Rory's desk.

PARIS

Hard paper.

LOUISE

A killer.

PARIS

How'd you do?

LOUISE

A.

PARIS

Me, too.

LOUISE

Small world.

PARIS

Isn't it? Madeline? What'd you
get?

MADELINE

You know I got a B.

3 CONTINUED: (2)

PARIS

B's not bad.

LOUISE

Not at all.

PARIS

Respectable even.

LOUISE

I'd be proud.

PARIS

A D however... that would be a cause for concern.

LOUISE

A cry for help.

PARIS

An job application to McDonald's.

LOUISE

Would you like fries with that?

PARIS

Hey, you know, everybody can't be smart. As my mother always says, somebody has to answer the phones.

MADELINE

Okay, I have no idea what you two are talking about.

PARIS

No. But Rory does.

Paris and Louise give Rory a satisfied smile. Rory gathers her things and exits the room sadly.

4 INT. CHILTON - HALLWAY - CONTINUOUS - DAY (DAY 2)

4

Rory exits. She walks a beat and then takes her paper out to look at it.

TRISTIN

(from behind her)

Hey, Mary.

RORY

(to herself)

And it just keeps getting better.

4 CONTINUED:

TRISTIN

You look sad.

RORY

I'm fine.

TRISTIN

Bad grade?

RORY

I have to go.

She starts to walk. He follows her.

TRISTIN

You know what, Mary, I just can't figure out why we're not friends. I think it's because I make you nervous.

RORY

I think it's 'cause you can't learn my name.

Tristin gets in front of her and leans in close.

TRISTIN

Do you have a boyfriend?

RORY

None of your business.

TRISTIN

Is that a no?

RORY

Is there no one else in this school for you to bother?

TRISTIN

I think you like me and you just don't know how to say it.

RORY

Oh, boy.

TRISTIN

What are you doing Friday night?

RORY

I'm busy.

4 CONTINUED: (2)

TRISTIN

What, do you have to be back at the convent by five?

RORY

Please, leave me alone.

TRISTIN

Well, since you said please.

Tristin grins at her and turns to walk away.

TRISTIN (cont'd)

Later, Mary.

Rory looks after him, completely frustrated.

5 INT. INDEPENDENCE INN - LOBBY - AFTERNOON (DAY 2)

MICHEL and DRELLA are arguing at the front desk. Lorelai comes downstairs to find them bickering.

DRELLA

Back off, Chevalier.

MICHEL

You are blind, stupid, and clumsy!

DRELLA

Yeah, well, at least I'm not French.

LORELAI

What is going on here?

MICHEL

She ran over my shoe.

DRELLA

You got in the way.

MICHEL

You aimed for me!

DRELLA

Yeah, well.

LORELAI

Okay, hold on...

MICHEL

She scratched my shoes.

5 CONTINUED:

DRELLA

Oh, what a baby.

MICHEL

These are three hundred dollar Italian loafers.

DRELLA

I wonder if Versace makes a pacifier.

MICHEL

You're fired!

LORELAI

Excuse me?

DRELLA

You can't fire me.

MICHEL

Then I dock your pay.

LORELAI

Sorry.

MICHEL

Can I kill her?

LORELAI

Not before high tea.

MICHEL

Then I will curse you. Constantly, and in several languages.

DRELLA

I'm going for the other foot.

LORELAI

Drella! To your corner! Now!

Drella glares at Michel and moves off.

MICHEL

(to Drella)

I win.

LORELAI

You are a grown man, Michel. Now, go to your desk and think about that.

5 CONTINUED: (2)

5

She notices a pile of letters on the desk.

LORELAI (cont'd)

(excited)

Oh, my God!

She grabs a "Four Star Dining" magazine out of the pile and starts running toward the kitchen.

6 INT. INDEPENDENCE INN - KITCHEN - CONTINUOUS - DAY (DAY 2)

Lorelai enters.

LORELAI

Sookie, I got it!

SOOKIE

My review?

LORELAI

Right here!

They start looking through the magazine.

SOOKIE

Where is it?

LORELAI

I'm looking.

SOOKIE

Hurry.

Rory enters, draped in her bags and holding her books. Lorelai looks up at her.

LORELAI

In theaters now. The thing that reads a lot.

Rory drops her bags to the floor with a thud.

RORY

Chocolate?

SOOKIE

Glass jar.

Rory heads over to the counter and starts digging into Sookie's vat of baking chocolate.

6 CONTINUED:

SOOKIE (cont'd)

Lorelai, look.

LORELAI

Right, sorry.

The two women rifle through the magazine.

RORY

Geez, who's naked?

LORELAI

Lucian Mills. Food critic.

RORY

Yeah? How's his butt?

LORELAI

He was supposed to review the restaurant in this month's... I got it!

SOOKIE

Is it good? Is he mean? Should I cry?

LORELAI

Okay, here we go.

(reading)

"The words divine, delectable, and delirious don't begin to describe the delicious experience of dining at the Independence Inn." Ooh, I'm smelling a rave.

SOOKIE

Really?

LORELAI

(reading)

"Only Chef Sookie St. James could make a simple salad of hothouse tomatoes and assorted fresh herbs seem like a religious experience. Her lobster bisque is worth every sinful, cream-filled, rich sip."

SOOKIE

See, I actually don't use that much cream. Just a really concentrated lobster stock and...

6 CONTINUED: (2)

LORELAI

Sookie, he's not here.

SOOKIE

Right. Go on.

LORELAI

(reading)

"The entrees are as heavenly as the starters. Though the much-lauded risotto was perfectly fine, it was the simple handkerchief pasta with a browned sage and butter sauce that sent me through the roof." Sookie, this is unbelievable. I've got to have this framed for the dining room.

SOOKIE

(a little deflated)

Oh. Yeah. That would be swell. Can I see that again?

Sookie grabs the magazine and re-reads the review.

LORELAI

We should celebrate. Tonight, the girls on the town.

RORY

I can't. I have to study.

LORELAI

Hey, are you okay?

Rory hesitates for a minute.

RORY

I'm just tired.

LORELAI

Well, we can celebrate tomorrow.

RORY

No, you guys go.

SOOKIE

You know, I should really get started on the shopping list.

LORELAI

What is going on here? (more)

6 .

6 CONTINUED: (3)

LORELAI (cont'd)

We are young and fiery women. Studying? Shopping lists? Where's to hell with it all? Where's throwing caution to the wind? Where's... oh shoot, the linen delivery.

Lorelai runs out. Rory calls after her.

RORY

You go, girl.

Rory goes back to the chocolate. She looks very unhappy. Sookie takes the review and starts reading it again. She's not so happy herself.

7 INT. LORELAI'S HOUSE - LIVING ROOM/KITCHEN - NIGHT (NIGHT 7 2)

Rory is studying at the kitchen table. Lorelai is watching TV.

LORELAI

News is on.

RORY

One sec.

Lorelai watches a beat.

LORELAI

And for our top story: Tonight, a grizzly horrible thing happened in a small town where no grizzly horrible thing's ever happened. Everyone's shocked.

She watches for another beat.

LORELAI (cont'd)

House slides down hill.

(beat)

Teens are dangerous. Stop procreating.

(beat)

Liposuction kills. Stay fat.

She turns off the TV.

7 CONTINUED:

LORELAI (cont'd)

Okay. I'm bored. Let's get ice

cream.

Rory doesn't answer. Lorelai crosses into the kitchen.

LORELAI (cont'd)

Hello?

RORY

Mom, I'm studying.

LORELAI

Yeah, but we're talking ice cream

here. How about a break?

RORY

I can't take a break now.

LORELAI

Okay. When?

RORY

Are you four?

LORELAI

No. I'm hungry.

RORY

Have more pizza.

LORELAI

It's cold.

RORY

Heat it up.

LORELAI

It's not the same.

RORY

Lorelai, go to your room!

LORELAI

Wow. Smart girls are mean.

RORY

Look, if you let me study now, I'll play with you this weekend.

LORELAI

Promise?

7 CONTINUED: (2)

RORY

Yes. We'll do anything you want.

LORELAI

You'll go to the shoe sale with me?

RORY

Yes.

LORELAI

And you'll let me try on anything I want?

RORY

Yes.

LORELAI

And you'll let me push other people out of the way if they're going for my size?

RORY

I'll even run interference for you.

LORELAI

You have a deal.

RORY

Good.

Rory goes back to her studying. Lorelai exits the kitchen. Beat. Lorelai comes back in.

LORELAI

So, I'm sorry, where did we land on the whole ice cream issue?

Rory packs up her books and goes in her room. Lorelai looks after her, confused. What just happened here?

FADE OUT.

END OF ACT ONE

ACT TWO

FADE IN:

8 EXT. ANTIQUE STORE - DAY (DAY 3)

8

Rory, in rumpled school gear and holding books, goes inside.

9 INT. ANTIQUE STORE - CONTINUOUS - DAY (DAY 3)

9

Rory enters.

RORY

Lane?

LANE (O.S.)

Rory?

RORY

Right or left?

LANE (O.S.)

Right.

RORY

Okay.

Rory goes to the right. No Lane.

RORY (cont'd)

I thought you said right.

LANE (O.S.)

Sorry. My right. Your left.

Rory goes the other direction. She turns a corner and finds LANE studying at one of the tables. There's a small plate with some sort of sad rice-cakey looking thing on it. Rory sits down with her and proceeds to open her books.

RORY

Hey.

LANE

You're late.

RORY

Sorry.

(looking at Lane's plate)

What is that?

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9 CONTINUED:

LANE

Twelve calories.

RORY

Here.

She pulls out a candy bar and hands it to Lane.

LANE

Oh, my God. Thank you.

She rips into it and takes a bite. Rory pulls out her huge book of notes.

LANE (cont'd)

Man, what's that?

RORY

My notes.

LANE

Really.

RORY

I don't think Shakespeare knew himself this well.

MRS. KIM comes over to the table with a CUSTOMER.

CUSTOMER

Ooh, I like. How much?

MRS. KIM

Five hundred.

CUSTOMER

Is that the best you can do?

MRS. KIM

Four fifty.

CUSTOMER

I'm not sure.

MRS. KIM

Three seventy-five and you take it right now.

CUSTOMER

Sold.

MRS. KIM

We appreciate your business.

(more)

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9 CONTINUED: (2)

MRS. KIM (cont'd)

(to the girls)

Move.

Mrs. Kim and the customer move off. Lane and Rory gather up their books.

RORY

I really miss Stars Hollow High.

LANE

You're kidding, right?

RORY

No. Chilton's just... I don't know. Hard.

LANE

What do you care? You were Miss Everything's So Easy at school. This should be a snap for you.

Rory looks at Lane a beat wanting to tell her she's got it all wrong. She can't. The girls settle at another table and start taking their stuff out again. Mrs. Kim comes over to the girls.

MRS. KIM

Nope. This is sold. Move.

She spots the candy bar on the table.

MRS. KIM (cont'd)

What's that?

RORY

It's mine.

MRS. KIM

That is chocolate covered death.

RORY

With a creamy caramel surprise.

Mrs Kim spots someone at the other end of the store and exits off. Rory and Lane gather up their stuff and move to yet another table.

LANE

So, this guy asked about you today.

RORY

What guy?

9 CONTINUED: (3)

LANE

The new kid. Tall, perfect.

RORY

What did he want to know?

LANE

Where you were.

RORY

What did you say?

LANE

That you were just too smart for us and had to go to the genius school.

RORY

Oh.

LANE

He seemed to like that. Guess he's into brainy chicks.

RORY

Well, I'll keep my eyes open for one for him.

They sit down and settle in at the new table.

MRS. KIM (O.S.)

No! Sold!

LANE

Mom...

MRS. KIM (O.S.)

Move!

LANE

(calling off)

Where do you want us to go?

MRS. KIM (O.S.)

A library!

The girls gather their stuff one last time.

LANE

I hate sales.

They exit off.

10 INT. INDEPENDENCE INN - LOBBY - LATE AFTERNOON (DAY 3)

10

Lorelai is gathering up her stuff. Drella is playing "Iron Man." Lorelai heads off toward the kitchen. She passes Drella.

LORELAI

No Black Sabbath.

DRELLA

No one's listening.

LORELAI

No Black Sabbath. No Steely Dan, no Boston, and no Queen.

DRELLA

What happened to you to make you so cold?

LORELAI

We like that Mozart.

Lorelai continues toward the kitchen.

DRELLA

(sighs)

I am the Artie Shaw of harpists.

11 INT. INDEPENDENCE INN - KITCHEN - CONTINUOUS - DAY (DAY 11 3)

Sookie is sitting at her little desk in the kitchen. She's obviously very depressed. Lorelai enters in a rush.

LORELAI

I need coffee to go.

SOOKIE

There's some fresh over there.

Lorelai looks at the coffee, which has boiled down to a syrup on the bottom of the pot.

LORELAI

Fresh in my first lifetime as Joan of Arc.

SOOKIE

Oh, I'm sorry. I thought I made some fresh. Here.

She gets up and makes coffee.

11 CONTINUED:

LORELAI

Bless you. I'm completely exhausted and I have to drive into Hartford tonight to attend a Parent-Teacher meeting.

SOOKIE

Sounds great.

LORELAI

Yeah. I mean, this school is so completely different then Stars Hollow. They send like a thousand pages of updates home every week. It's a very intense place.

SOOKIE

Um hum.

LORELAI

Last week, there was a huge debate over allowing a plaid scrunchie to be acceptable head wear. People took sides. Things got very ugly. The scrunchie motion finally passed and I like to think I was the tiebreaker.

SOOKIE

That's nice.

Sookie sits back down at her little desk and slips back into her funk. Lorelai goes over to Sookie.

LORELAI

Honey, are you okay?

SOOKIE

He said it was fine.

LORELAI

Who said it was fine?

SOOKIE

Lucian Mills.

LORELAI

The restaurant critic?

SOOKIE

He said my risotto is fine.

11 CONTINUED: (2)

LORELAI

Isn't it?

SOOKIE

(indignant)

No. It's not fine. Fine is a word you use when you get stopped on the street by someone you sort of know but you don't really want to talk to and they ask you how you are and you say you're fine. Because it's just enough that they feel you're doing okay so they don't have to talk to you anymore but they can feel like they were considerate enough that they asked and that if maybe you weren't fine they would actually listen to what's bothering you even if they wouldn't want to.

LORELAI

Sookie, I don't think he meant fine as a slam. Or as a monologue.

SOOKIE

He couldn't have meant it any other way.

LORELAI

I don't want you to get so upset over this one little review.

SOOKIE

This is pride, Lorelai. I mean, you know about this risotto. When my mother was on her deathbed, I --

LORELAI

You made her the risotto, and she lived another three years. I know.

SOOKIE

She was supposed to be dead. The doctors told us she wouldn't make it through the night. I lost a down payment on a casket.

LORELAI

And she lived because of the risotto. It's the magic risotto.

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11 CONTINUED: (3)

11

SOOKIE

And that man had the nerve to call it fine.

LORELAI

I don't think he knew the story.

JACKSON enters.

JACKSON

Okay, before you get goofy on me I don't have the porcinis. I forgot them. I have no other excuse than plain old stupid human error and I brought you morels which is not what you want, so come on, let me have it.

SOOKIE

Morels are fine.

JACKSON

(to Lorelai, taken aback)
Did anyone else feel a shift in
the space/time continuum?

LORELAI

A reviewer didn't like the risotto.

JACKSON

The magic risotto? You're kidding.

LORELAI

Look, I have to go. Try and cheer her up a little, would you?

JACKSON

Sure.

Lorelai gives Sookie a hug.

LORELAI

Forget this, sweetie. You're the best. We all know it.

Lorelai exits. Jackson stands there a minute, not quite knowing what to say to the sad Sookie.

JACKSON

So... I hear the huckleberry crop's going to completely suck this year.

Sookie just looks at him.

11 CONTINUED: (4)

11

JACKSON (cont'd)

I'm not good at consoling.

Sookie just sighs.

12 INT. CHILTON - CLASSROOM - EVENING (NIGHT 3)

12

Teacher Max Medina's classroom has been turned into a parental meeting place. In the back of the room a table is set up with coffee and cookies. Seated in the chairs are several STERN-FACED, WELL-HEELED parents. Max is leaning against his desk.

MAX

We'll be focusing on Elizabethan literature this semester. Shakespeare, Marlowe, Bacon, John Webster...

MAN #1

Is Marlowe really that significant?

MAX

We want to give as complete an overview as possible.

WOMAN #1

Yes, but will he be included on the Advanced Placement test?

MAX

We can't know exactly what will be on the AP test, but it will definitely be important for future studies once your kids hit their universities.

MAN #1

But to get there, they need to pass the AP test.

MAX

All of this is important and could very well be included.

WOMAN #2

How do we find out?

MAX

Bribe someone on the AP committee.

Several parents look like they're considering this.

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12 CONTINUED:

MAX (cont'd)

I was kidding.

The door opens and Lorelai enters. She's still in her work suit but now she wears a B-52s tee shirt under her jacket. The whole room looks at her, Max more interested than the others.

LORELAI

Sorry I'm late. Terrible pothole incident. You don't care. Please go on.

She knocks into a globe.

LORELAI (cont'd)

(joking)

What in the world...

(realizing the joke's not going over well)

I'll sit now.

She sits. The parents turn back to Max.

MAX

I'm sorry, we never met.

LORELAI

Oh, I'm Lorelai Gilmore. Rory's mom.

XAM

Glad you could join us.

(to the other parents)

Rory's one of our new students.

WOMAN #1

How nice. Now the AP test...

MAX

Yes. Well, we're preparing them as best we can.

Lorelai spots the coffee set up at the back of the class. She carefully makes her way over to the pot and pours herself a cup.

MAN #2

I've hired a tutor for Bethany.

MAX

Always a valid option.

12 CONTINUED: (2)

12

Lorelai takes a sip of the coffee. She starts to choke. Everyone turns around to look at her.

LORELAI

Jesus, Mary, Joseph and the camel!

She notices the stares.

LORELAI (cont'd)

Really bad coffee.

The parents look at each other.

LORELAI (cont'd)

(louder to the room)

So, the AP test, what are we doing about it, huh?

The parents shake their heads and then turn back to Max who is finding Lorelai infinitely amusing.

XAM

Okay, so the next test is currently scheduled for next month. Saturday, the twenty-fifth, at seven a.m.

Lorelai raises her hand.

MAX (cont'd)

Ms. Gilmore.

LORELAI

Okay, where is the test?

MAX

It will be given here.

LORELAI

Here.

MAX

Right.

LORELAI

On the twenty-fifth at seven o'clock.

MAX

Yes.

LORELAI

Okay, good.

12 CONTINUED: (3)

XAM

Any other questions?

LORELAI

Yeah, can parents come?

WOMAN #1

What?

LORELAI

It's just kind of exciting that's all. I thought, maybe it's stupid, but...

XAM

No, it's not stupid.

LORELAI

I would just love to see the excitement.

MAN #2

It's a test.

LORELAI

I know.

MAN #2

What's exciting about a test?

LORELAI

You play golf?

MAN #2

Yes, I do.

LORELAI

You explain yours, I'll explain mine.

MAX

Okay, let's get back to the meeting.

WOMAN #1

(whispering to a Woman #2) That's the one who voted for the scrunchies.

WOMAN #2

Must be a scholarship student.

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12 CONTINUED: (4)

LORELAI

(starting to stand, insulted)

Excuse me?

MAX

Okay, I think this would be a good time for a break.

The room disperses. Max walks over to Lorelai.

MAX (cont'd)

What were you going to do, hit her?

LORELAI

No. But I had some good verbal comebacks ready.

MAX

Like?

LORELAI

"Scholarship this" was the front-runner.

Lorelai takes another sip of coffee. She grimaces.

LORELAI (cont'd)

And it just gets worse.

MAX

Not drinking it is always an option.

LORELAI

Not in my world.

MAX

I'm Max Medina.

LORELAI

Nice to meet you.

XAM

I apologize for the behavior of some of our guests tonight. This is a tense time for some people.

LORELAI

What, the SAT season?

MAX

The waking hours.

Lorelai smiles at him.

12 CONTINUED: (5)

LORELAI

Hey, are you this nice to my kid?

MAX

Ah, it's easy. Rory's a sweet girl.

LORELAI

She is, she is.

MAX

How is she liking Chilton?

LORELAI

Oh, she loves it.

MAX

Really?

LORELAI

I mean, it's obviously an adjustment for her. But she really wants to go to Harvard and this is how she'll get there.

MAX

Harvard.

LORELAI

Tall, bricks, ivy...

MAX

I've heard of it.

LORELAI

Ever since Rory could crawl I've wanted her to go there.

MAX

It's a great school.

LORELAI

I actually bought her a Harvard sweatshirt when she was four, which, of course, was way too big for her so she used it as a blanket for a while and then as a make-shift diaper on a really ill-fated shopping trip and I've now told you a story that would so mortify her she'll kill me when she finds out you know.

12 CONTINUED: (6)

XAM

Well, don't tell her then. It'll be our secret.

LORELAI

I'd appreciate that.

They smile at each other a beat.

MAX

(off her tee shirt)
So, you're a B-52s girl.

LORELAI

What?

(looks at her shirt)
Oh. Actually, I'm a klutz girl
who shouldn't drive with a cup of
coffee in her hand. I just had
this in the car.

XAM

Well, I hope Rory adjusts to this place. We need her here.

LORELAI

Thank you. That's nice.

MAX

And I hope she's not too disappointed about her paper because it's very hard to catch up on all that reading material. I know a D seems pretty dismal, but...

LORELAI

What? Rory got a D?

MAX

Yes, but...

LORELAI

Rory's never gotten a D.

12 CONTINUED: (7)

12

MAX

Well, it was the first paper she's had to turn in and she was bound to falter a little.

LORELAI

Oh, man. This totally explains the no ice cream thing. God, I'm such an idiot.

MAX

The ice cream thing?

LORELAI

Look, I've got to go.

MAX

I'm sorry if I said something to...

LORELAI

If Rory got a D she's not feeling too hot right now and I'd kind of like to be there.

MAX

I understand.

LORELAI

So, it's been nice meeting you.

XAM

You, too.

LORELAI

Keep up the good work. And don't ever make coffee again.

XAM

I won't. I promise.

Lorelai exits off. Max looks off after her, obviously smitten.

FADE OUT.

END OF ACT TWO

ACT THREE

FADE IN:

13 INT. LUKE'S DINER - NIGHT (NIGHT 3)

13

Rory is sitting at a table studying. She scribbles furiously, then erases what she wrote. Scribbles again, this time her pencil breaks. She throws it down in frustration. LUKE comes over with a piece of pie.

LUKE

Here.

RORY

What's this?

LUKE

You look like you need pie.

RORY

I do?

LUKE

Violent pencil tossing usually signals a need for pie.

RORY

What if I had thrown a pen?

LUKE

I would've brought you trout.

RORY

What?

LUKE

I don't make the rules. I just carry them out.

Luke crosses off. Lorelai comes in the door. Luke passes her.

LORELAI

Hey, backwards baseball cap. New look for you.

LUKE

She's over there.

LORELAI

Thanks.

(more)

(CONTINUED)

13 CONTINUED:

13

LORELAI (cont'd)

(she spots Rory)

She eating pie? Did she have dinner yet?

LUKE

You raised her. I just serve.

Luke crosses off. Lorelai goes over to Rory and sits down.

LORELAI

Hey, bookworm.

RORY

Finally. Where were you?

LORELAI

Actually, Hartford.

RORY

Why?

LORELAI

Well, because tonight was the...

RORY

(remembering, busted)

Parent-Teacher Meeting. Oh, my God.

LORELAI

Yeah.

RORY

I forgot.

LORELAI

It went very well. I was extremely charming and really won the crowd over. They made me queen.

RORY

So, I guess you talked to Mr. Medina.

LORELAI

Yeah.

Rory doesn't say anything.

13 CONTINUED: (2)

LORELAI (cont'd)

I can't believe you let me whine about ice cream and shoe sales when you had this major thing going on.

RORY

I know.

LORELAI

I hate when I'm an idiot and I don't even know it. I like to be aware of my idiocy. Revel in it. Take a few pictures. We missed a prime Christmas card picture opportunity there.

RORY

I'm sorry.

LORELAI

You should've told me.

RORY

I couldn't.

LORELAI

You couldn't tell me? You tell me everything.

RORY

It was too humiliating.

LORELAI

You once told me that you loved Saved By The Bell. What could be more humiliating than that?

RORY

I couldn't even form the words. I couldn't even say it. I couldn't even comprehend it. I have never gotten a D. Ever.

LORELAI

I know.

RORY .

I broke my arm and couldn't write for a month and I still got an A minus.

13 CONTINUED: (3)

LORELAI

Well, that was a different school.

RORY

Yeah, I know. It was Stars Hollow High. A D at Stars Hollow is like an F at Chilton. Or worse probably. It's like a G. Or a W.

LORELAI

So, I'm guessing you didn't do too well on your spelling test either.

RORY

Please don't tell Grandma and Grandpa.

LORELAI

Okay, now hold on...

RORY

They'll want their money back.

LORELAI

I won't tell them.

RORY

A D. I suck.

LORELAI

You do not suck.

RORY

I can't do this.

LORELAI

Now you listen to me. A D is bad. But all this talk about sucking and you can't do this, the self pity thing, that's worse. That's not you. You don't feel sorry for yourself. You didn't when it took you three months to ride a bicycle and you won't now.

RORY

Four months.

LORELAI

What?

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13 CONTINUED: (4)

RORY

It took me four months to learn to ride a bike.

LORELAI

Really? Four months?

RORY

Yeah, you want to belabor the conversation?

LORELAI

Okay, forget about the bike. Just listen to me. A D is one grade. It is not the rest of your life. You will catch up and you will do better. Period. You come from hearty stubborn stock, my dear. If there is one thing that I gave you it is my stubbornness.

RORY

I am not stubborn.

LORELAI

You are, too.

RORY

I am not.

LORELAI

Fine, you're not.

RORY

Thank you.

LORELAI

You're welcome. You <u>can</u> do this, Rory. And I will help you. I will get you through this. Now put the D behind you. Oh look, where is it? Behind you. Can't see it. Buh-bye. Okay, what's next?

Rory takes a deep breath.

RORY

I have a test on Friday.

LORELAI

A test. Good.

13 CONTINUED: (5)

RORY

On Shakespeare.

LORELAI

The Bard with the beard. Check.

RORY

It's twenty percent of my grade.

LORELAI

That just makes life interesting. Now, what do we have to do to get you an A on that test?

RORY

Well, I need to learn all my study notes. There's three chapters in the book that they covered before I started there.

LORELAI

Do you have to do the "out, damn spot" thing? Cause I love that.

RORY

You really think I can do this?

LORELAI

I'll bet you a dollar.

RORY

One dollar.

LORELAI

A new one. With the big head.

RORY

That's it? That's what my future is worth? One dollar?

LORELAI

Two dollars?

RORY

Two dollars.

LORELAI

Well, come on. You did get a D.

Rory shakes her head and smiles at Lorelai. Lorelai and Rory eat the pie and strategize about the study sessions.

13

14 INT. INDEPENDENCE INN - KITCHEN - MORNING (DAY 4)

14

No longer the lethargic Sookie we saw in the last scene. Bowls of risotto are lined up on the counter and Sookie is intensely stirring several pots on the stove. Lorelai enters.

LORELAI

Hey Sookie, did you see the --

Sookie shoves a spoonful of risotto into Lorelai's mouth.

SOOKIE

Good?

LORELAI

Hot.

SOOKIE

What about this?

She shoves another spoonful into Lorelai's mouth.

SOOKIE (cont'd)

Better?

LORELAI

Hotter.

SOOKIE

Wait, there's one more.

LORELAI

Sookie, what's with all the risotto? Have we gone theme now? Is this like the scotch tape store?

SOOKIE

I've tried forty different recipes, okay? Forty. And every single time I came back to the same conclusion.

LORELAI

That yours is better.

SOOKIE

Yes.

LORELAI

It is.

A WAITER comes into the kitchen.

14 CONTINUED: 14

39.

WAITER

You were looking for me?

SOOKIE

Yes! Great! A guy came in here three weeks ago. Lucian Mills. He ordered the risotto and he didn't like it.

WAITER

(shocked)

The magic risotto? You're kidding.

LORELAI

Not helping.

SOOKIE

He was a restaurant critic so he ordered several things and probably didn't finish them. He mentioned in the review that his waiter had a goatee and you have a goatee so you waited on him. I need info.

WAITER

Well, what did he look like?

SOOKIE

Like he was unhappy with the risotto.

WAITER

I don't know...

SOOKIE

And he may have been with an annoying table companion that wouldn't let him concentrate on what he was eating!

WAITER

I serve a lot of people...

SOOKIE

He might've been wearing a fake beard. Or a wig. Or false teeth. Or one of those plastic glasses with the big nose on them!

WAITER

(to Lorelai) May I be fired now?

14 CONTINUED: (2)

14

LORELAI

Absolutely.

The waiter exits. Sookie goes after him.

SOOKIE

What about a guy with an annoying companion and a fake wig who was sitting under an air conditioning vent next to a woman with too much perfume on?

Sookie exits. Lorelai just sighs, picks up a spoon and starts eating some of the risotto.

15 EXT. CHILTON - DAY (DAY 4)

15

It's lunch time. Rory is sitting on a bench studying.

TIGHT PROFILE SHOT of Rory reading. Suddenly Paris's face appears in back of Rory.

PARIS

"Let me not to the marriage of true minds

Admit impediments. Love is not love

Which alters when it alteration finds,

Or bends with the remover to remove:

O no! it is an ever-fixed mark
That looks on tempests and is neve

That looks on tempests and is never shaken;

It is the star to every wandering bark,

Whose worth's unknown, although his height be taken."
(beat)

You're going down.

Paris's face disappears. Rory drops her head in frustration.

16 EXT. LORELAI'S HOUSE - NIGHT (NIGHT 4)

16

As WE PUSH IN, we hear Lorelai and Rory's voices.

LORELAI (O.S.)

The Comedy of Errors. Written...

RORY (O.S.)

Uh, fifteen ninety?

16 CONTINUED:

16

LORELAI (O.S.)

Published?

RORY (O.S.)

Sixteen ninety-eight?

LORELAI (O.S.)

Sixteen twenty-three. Close.

17 INT. LORELAI'S HOUSE - LIVING ROOM - CONTINUOUS - NIGHT (NIGHT 4)

Lorelai and Rory are on the couch. Books and papers are scattered everywhere. They've obviously been at this a long time.

RORY

How is sixteen twenty-three close?

LORELAI

You got the sixteen part right.

RORY

I was off by seventy-five years.

LORELAI

Anything under a hundred years is close.

RORY

What kind of rule is that?

LORELAI

Hey, I'm running the study session here, okay? Now, Richard III.

RORY

Fifteen ninety-one?

LORELAI

(a la game show buzzer)

EEEEH!

RORY

Ninety-three?

LORELAI

EEEH!

RORY

Ninety-six?

LORELAI

EEEEH!

17 CONTINUED:

17

RORY

Okay, that's getting really annoying now.

18 INT. LORELAI'S HOUSE - LIVING ROOM/KITCHEN - A FEW HOURS 18 LATER - NIGHT (NIGHT 4)

Cookies, mac and cheese, fried chicken, several jumbo coffee cups and assorted candy bags are strewn all over the living room. Lorelai is sprawled on the couch dead tired. Rory sits at the kitchen table, equally cluttered with study rations, with a cold washcloth over her eyes.

LORELAI

Go on. I'm listening.

RORY

The sonnets are one hundred fiftyfour poems of fourteen lines...

LORELAI

Except...

RORY

Except for one twenty-six, which is twelve lines.

LORELAI

Good.

RORY

They're written in iambic pentameter...

LORELAI

Except...

RORY

Except for one forty-five, which is in tetrameter.

LORELAI

Rock on, sister.

RORY

Really?

LORELAI

Not one mistake.

RORY

Wow.

18 CONTINUED:

LORELAI

So, how do you feel?

RORY

Nauseous.

LORELAI

Yeah. I don't think the fries in the horseradish sauce was the brightest idea we've ever had.

RORY

It was satisfying in the moment though.

LORELAI

You are going to blow that class away tomorrow.

RORY

You think?

LORELAI

I think. Hey, what do you say we call it a night and get some beauty sleep.

RORY

You go ahead. I just want to review my notes one more time.

LORELAI

That's okay. I'll stay up.

RORY

Mom, go to sleep.

LORELAI

Please, I'm not tired. I was just thinking about you is all.

Lorelai leans back on the couch and closes her eyes. We pan over to Rory at the kitchen table opening her books.

19 INT. LORELAI'S HOUSE - KITCHEN/LIVING ROOM - A LITTLE 19 WHILE LATER - NIGHT (NIGHT 4)

Rory is still studying. She gets up and gets herself a glass of water. She walks into the living room where she sees Lorelai dead asleep on the couch. Rory gets a blanket off a chair, covers Lorelai up and then goes back to the kitchen table, sits and opens her book.

20 INT. LORELAI'S HOUSE - LIVING ROOM/KITCHEN - A LITTLE WHILE LATER - NIGHT (NIGHT 4)

20

Lorelai is still asleep on the couch. She wakes up and still groggy, sits up. She glances into the kitchen where she sees Rory at the kitchen table with her head down on her books, fast asleep. Lorelai wraps the blanket around her and goes into the kitchen. She sits down next to Rory. She puts half the blanket over her, lies down on the table and falls asleep next to her kid.

21 INT. LORELAI'S HOUSE - KITCHEN - MORNING (DAY 5)

21

Lorelai and Rory are still asleep at the kitchen table. Rory stirs. She opens her eyes and sees the bright sunlight streaming in. She sits up, panicked.

RORY

No. Oh, no!

She jumps up and runs into her bedroom yanking the blanket off of Lorelai, waking her up.

LORELAI

What?

(her neck is stiff)

Ow. Geez. Such a bad sleeping idea.

RORY (O.S.)

I'm late!

LORELAI

What?

RORY (O.S.)

I'm late! I'm late! I woke up

late!

LORELAI

Okay, calm down.

RORY

I can't calm down! I've missed my bus! Get up!

LORELAI

Sweetie, mommy can't move right now. Mommy's been sleeping at a right angle all night.

Rory runs out of her bedroom putting shoes on.

RORY

I'm going to miss the test!

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21 CONTINUED:

LORELAI

No, you won't. Grab the keys, let's go.

Lorelai jumps up and then stops.

LORELAI (cont'd)

I can't drive you.

RORY

You have to! I missed my bus!

LORELAI

I have a meeting at the inn at eight.

RORY

Mom!

LORELAI

Stop! Okay. Think. You take the car.

RORY

What?

LORELAI

You take the car, I'll get Sookie to pick me up. Here.

Lorelai runs over to her purse and takes a cell phone out and grabs her car keys. She hands it to Rory.

LORELAI (cont'd)

Take this, take these, and go.

RORY

Are you sure?

LORELAI

Go, go, go!

RORY

I'm gone!

Rory runs out of the house.

LORELAI

(calling after her)

Good luck!

Lorelai, still stiff, sits back down in the chair and drops her head back on the table.

FADE OUT.

END OF ACT THREE

ACT FOUR

FADE IN:

22 EXT. ROAD - MORNING (DAY 5)

22

Rory is driving along, very tense about her situation. She suddenly thinks about something. Keeping her eyes on the road she reaches into her backpack to look for something. She reaches a stop sign. She stops. She pulls Lorelai's cell phone out of her backpack and dials.

23 INT. LANE'S HOUSE - SAME TIME - MORNING (DAY 5)

23

We're TIGHT on Lane, who is sitting in a pile of brightly colored pillows listening to music and reading a 'zine. Behind her are brightly colored rock posters and artwork. Next to her is a lava lamp. All you see is color and Lane sitting in the middle of it. Her phone RINGS.

LANE

(into the phone)

Hello?

We will cut back and forth as needed.

RORY

Did I leave a set of my notes at your house yesterday?

LANE

Where are you?

RORY

I'm driving to school. I need to check on something and I can't find some of my notes.

LANE

Hold on, I'll check.

Lane gets up and opens a door.

24 INT. LANE'S ROOM - CONTINUOUS - MORNING (DAY 5)

24

Lane emerges from what we now see is her closet. Her bedroom is in stark contrast to the brightly colored haven she created in closet world. Her room is completely beige, including the bedding, with one lone crucifix hanging over her bed as the only decoration. Lane looks around.

24 CONTINUED:

LANE

I don't see anything.

RORY

What did I do with them?

LANE

Maybe they're downstairs in the store.

RORY

Maybe. I just don't...

WHAM! The Jeep shakes. Rory looks around, startled, and sees a STUNNED DEER staggering away from the Jeep.

RORY (cont'd)

Oh, my God.

LANE

Are you all right?

RORY

I just got hit by a deer!

LANE

You hit a deer?

RORY

No. I got hit by a deer!

LANE

How do you get hit by a deer?

RORY

I was at a stop sign and he hit me! Oh, my God!

Rory gets out of the car.

25 EXT. ROAD - CONTINUOUS - MORNING (DAY 5)

25

Rory gets out and runs around looking for the deer.

LANE

Was it a four way stop?

RORY

What does that matter?

25 CONTINUED:

LANE

I don't know. I don't know what to ask after you've been hit by a deer.

RORY

I don't see him.

LANE

Put salt down! Deers like salt.

RORY

Where am I going to get salt?

LANE

Do you have a lunch?

RORY

Lane!

LANE

Sorry.

RORY

I can't see him anywhere. What if he's hurt?

LANE

Rory, your test!

RORY

What time is it?

LANE

It's seven-forty.

RORY

No!

She hangs up and runs back to the car, gets in, and drives off.

26 INT. CHILTON - HALLWAY - A LITTLE LATER - DAY (DAY 5)

26

We come up on a clock the reads EIGHT FIFTEEN. Rory comes tearing around the corner running at full speed down the completely empty hallway.

25

27 INT. CHILTON - CLASSROOM - CONTINUOUS - DAY (DAY 5)

27

Rory bursts through the door. The entire class looks up from their tests, Paris with a bit of a triumphant smile.

MAX

Back to your tests, please.

All heads go down. Paris puts her head down but sneaks a look at what's about to transpire.

RORY

I'm sorry, I...

MAX

Miss Gilmore, you'll have to wait in the library.

RORY

But what about the test?

MAX

(sympathetically)

I'm afraid you've missed the test.

RORY

No.

MAX

We start class promptly...

RORY

No!

MAX

(overlapping)

...at eight-o-five and that's when I need people to be in their seats.

RORY

Please.

MAX

It's the rules. I'm sorry.

RORY

But you don't understand. I was up all night studying. And then I missed the bus so I had to drive...

MAX

Let's discuss this outside.

27 CONTINUED:

RORY

...and then I'm driving down this road and I stop and I get hit by a deer!

XAM

You hit a deer?

RORY

No. I got hit by a deer! You don't believe me? I've got antler prints in the side of my mother's car!

MAX

Rory, come on.

RORY

No! I'm not leaving! I won't leave! You have to let me take this test! I'm ready for this test! I know everything there is to know about Shakespeare...

MAX

Okay, you need to calm down, now.

RORY

I know his birthdate and his mother's name and the kind of ink he used!

PARIS

(under her breath)

Loser.

Rory hears this and runs over to Paris's desk.

RORY

And just what is your problem, huh? You already have everything! You already have the grades and the status! What the hell is wrong with you that you have this constant need to be the biggest bitch in the entire world!

MAX

Okay, let's go.

Max tries to get Rory out the door.

27 CONTINUED: (2)

27

28

RORY

(to Paris)

Huh? No answer? What's up, quippy? Why so silent?

MAX

Outside, now.

Rory follows Max toward the door. She passes Tristin's desk and turns on him.

RORY

And for the last time, the name is Rory!!!!!!

Max pushes Rory out the door. The class looks at each other, completely stunned at the scene they just witnessed.

28 INT. INDEPENDENCE INN - LOBBY - SAME TIME - DAY (DAY 5)

Michel is standing, taking down notes.

LORELAI

Make sure that carpet is replaced perfectly before they go.

MICHEL

Okay.

LORELAI

I mean perfectly. Nailed down and everything.

MICHEL

Oh, you mean that perfectly. I thought you meant the other perfectly. The one that would be misinterpreted by the other Michel, the one who couldn't understand what you meant by perfectly.

Lorelai walks past Drella and her harp.

DRELLA

Hey, what do you think about Pat Benetar?

LORELAI

Great idea. Can she play the harp?

A LOUD SCREAM is heard from the kitchen. Lorelai takes off after the sound.

29 INT. INDEPENDENCE INN - KITCHEN - CONTINUOUS - DAY (DAY 5)

29

A jubilant Sookie is whooping it up and dancing around the kitchen. She's waving a piece of paper around in the air. Lorelai rushes in.

SOOKIE

I found it! I found it!

LORELAI

You found what?

SOOKIE

His bill! I found his bill!

LORELAI

What are you talking about?

SOOKIE

It wasn't the risotto. It was the wine! He ordered the wrong wine!

LORELAI

Oh. Well, great.

SOOKIE

See, he mentioned in the review that he had the summer tomato salad, which I only made once in the last three weeks because Jackson, of course, decided to punch out his tomato grower and well, that's another story.

LORELAI

Yes. Save it for Christmas time.

SOOKIE

So, then Brian, the goateed waiter only worked one shift that week because his girlfriend kicked him out and he had to move.

LORELAI

Celia kicked him out?

SOOKIE

Well, he didn't want kids.

LORELAI

She knew that when he moved in.

29 CONTINUED:

SOOKIE

Women always think they can change men.

LORELAI

Yeah.

SOOKIE

So, anyhow, I narrowed down the day, checked the bills and found out that there was a party at table six that ordered practically everything on the menu, including...

LORELAI

The magic risotto!

SOOKIE

And, with the risotto, a reisling. A reisling!

LORELAI

Why not just drink battery acid?

SOOKIE

Exactly! It changes the flavor of the dish and the fact that Brian even served it makes me think that Celia is better off without him.

LORELAI

I'm so glad, hon.

They hug. Jackson comes in with a box of zucchini.

JACKSON

Okay, Here's the zucchini.

SOOKIE

(with a flourish)

Too small! Take them away!

Sookie triumphantly moves off. Jackson turns to Lorelai.

JACKSON

It's good to have her back, huh?

LORELAI

Yeah.

JACKSON

Yeah.

(more)

29 CONTINUED: (2)

29

JACKSON (cont'd)

(beat)

You're still paying for the zucchini though.

Michel enters with the cell phone.

MICHEL

(to Lorelai)

There's a man with a funny accent on the phone asking for you.

LORELAI

Really? Did you guys exchange the secret handshake?

She takes the phone.

LORELAI (cont'd)

(into phone)

Lorelai, here.

She exits off, leaving Jackson and Michel staring at each other.

MICHEL

And so, being a grown man has not dissuaded you from wearing the overalls, hmm?

30 INT. CHILTON - HALLWAY OUTSIDE THE HEADMASTER'S OFFICE - 30 AFTERNOON (DAY 5)

A solemn Rory sits on a bench in a lonely hallway. Lorelai comes running down the hall up to her.

LORELAI

Rory! What happened? Are you all right?

RORY

I got hit by a deer.

LORELAI

You got what...

RORY

And I was late and then they wouldn't let me take the test so I...

LORELAI

They what?

30 CONTINUED:

30

RORY

They said I couldn't take the test and I...

LORELAI

Oh, you are kidding me.

RORY

Mom...

LORELAI

No. It's okay. You just stay right here. I'll handle this.

Lorelai, pissed as hell, goes into the Headmaster's office.

31 INT. CHILTON - HEADMASTER'S OFFICE - A MOMENT LATER - DAY 31 (DAY 5)

Headmaster Charleston and Max are seated, talking. Lorelai enters.

LORELAI

Hello? Excuse me?

CHARLESTON

Ms. Gilmore, please come in.

LORELAI

Thank you.

Lorelai comes in.

CHARLESTON

Have a seat.

LORELAI

I think there's been a terrible misunderstanding. See, Rory told me that you wouldn't allow her to take the test.

CHARLESTON

She was late.

LORELAI

I know. I'm sorry about that. But there were circumstances beyond her control. I mean, Rory is never late. She's almost annoyingly on time. I'm sure if you checked your records you'd see that...

31 CONTINUED:

CHARLESTON

Her past performance has nothing to do with today's situation.

LORELAI

Okay, but see, she was up all night studying, with me. I was there so she's got a witness.

CHARLESTON

She's not on trial here.

LORELAI

Yes, well, your honor...

He looks at her.

LORELAI (cont'd)

Just a little trial humor. That won't happen again. Okay, see, she woke up late and broke her neck to get here, and we don't live locally as you know, and...

CHARLESTON

My dog ate my homework.

LORELAI

Excuse me?

CHARLESTON

My computer crashed and I lost my mid-term.

LORELAI

I wasn't making excuses...

CHARLESTON

My grandmother, aunt, first cousin, died. My sister took my report to school instead of hers. There's a family situation at home that has made it impossible to study. My religion prohibits studying after sundown. I went blind last night but now I'm fine.

LORELAI

Look, that is not Rory.

CHARLESTON

Rules are rules, Ms. Gilmore. (more)

31 CONTINUED: (2)

31

CHARLESTON (cont'd)

If you're late, then you forfeit the right to take the test.

Headmaster Charleston gets up and walks to the door.

LORELAI

(confused)

Where are you going?

(to Max)

Where is he going?

MAX

Lorelai, believe me, if there was anything I could do...

LORELAI

You can let her take the test.

MAX

I afraid I can't.

LORELAI

That's not fair.

CHARLESTON

Ms. Gilmore, we are not here to be fair. We are here to educate.

LORELAI

That's right. And I'm asking you to educate my kid.

CHARLESTON

We will when she's on time. Have a nice day.

He opens the door.

LORELAI

Are you holding that door open for a reason?

CHARLESTON

Our meeting is over.

LORELAI

(getting pissed)

Like hell it is.

MAX

Lorelai...

31 CONTINUED: (3)

31

Lorelai stands up.

LORELAI

Do you have any idea what we've been going through? We've been up all night every night this week studying! We haven't slept, we haven't talked about one thing except this school and this test for the last seven days! We have stretched ourselves as thin as we possibly could without going completely postal! My God! We're only one person!

CHARLESTON

Why don't we narrow the field of conversation down to Rory.

LORELAI

Fine, why don't we? You all sit up here in your snotty school that's desperately in need of some extra heating vents and you nurture horrible kids that treat each other like mortal enemies, you set ridiculous standards that make normal people feel less than everyone else, you take a great kid like Rory and tear her apart!

MAX

I don't think that's completely fair.

LORELAI

(turning on Max)

And you! You say things like she'll do fine and she's smart and this stodgy rotting rathole could use someone like her, and then you shut her out of a test that she's been cramming for and she's ready for, and she completely deserves to take!

MAX

(to Headmaster Charleston)
I never called this place a rathole.

31 CONTINUED: (4)

LORELAI

No, I added that. Wouldn't want you to get in trouble with Il Duce here. I thought this school was going to be great. That it was the opportunity of a lifetime. Well, I guess I can just add it to my "boy, was I wrong" list. Right below gauchos, but just above the Flashdance phase.

CHARLESTON

My goodness, you do like to throw fits in your family.

LORELAI

What are you talking about?

CHARLESTON

Your daughter threw a similar, though not quite as manic, fit of her own this morning.

LORELAI

Oh, please. Rory never throws fits. She's the most even-tempered person I know.

CHARLESTON

Well, then she did a lovely impression of you.

LORELAI

I don't...

CHARLESTON

Ms. Gilmore, everything you said in your rant is absolutely true, without the colorful embellishments, of course. We do set impossible standards and such standards do foster highly competitive children. However, that is life and that is Chilton.

LORELAI

Rules can change, you can change them.

31 CONTINUED: (5)

31

CHARLESTON

I told your daughter when she first came here that this place is not for everybody and may not be for her. I will now tell you the same thing.

LORELAI

Okay, but...

CHARLESTON

She doesn't have to be here. She doesn't have to go to Harvard and maybe she shouldn't. If she can't handle the pressure she should leave. But rules are the same for every child in this school. They will not change for her or for you. And you need to leave here now and decide what you intend to do. However, another outburst like this from either of you will not be part of the option list. Thank you for coming down. That will be all.

32 INT. CHILTON - HALLWAY OUTSIDE THE HEADMASTER'S OFFICE - 32 A MOMENT LATER - DAY (DAY 5)

Lorelai is now sitting next to Rory. Both of them look busted. They sit for a long beat, then Lorelai looks over at Rory.

LORELAI

You got hit by a deer?

33 EXT. CHILTON - MINUTES LATER - DAY (DAY 5)

33

Lorelai and Rory are standing outside the Jeep staring at the side of it. We see antlers imprinted on the passenger side.

LORELAI

You did. You got hit by a deer.

RORY

It just came out of nowhere.

LORELAI

You couldn't just run into a wall like other kids?

33 CONTINUED:

RORY

Can we just go home please?

LORELAI

Yeah. Sure, come on.

They get into the car.

34 EXT. STARS HOLLOW HOME - PORCH - DAY (DAY 5)

34

33

Sookie, calm -- almost glowing, stands on the porch of an unfamiliar home. She's holding a covered plate in one hand, a glass of wine in the other. She takes a deep breath, then awkwardly rings a doorbell with her elbow, then turns away from the door so she is facing the street. The door opens a crack, the security chain keeping the door in place. We don't see the REVIEWER, we just hear his voice.

REVIEWER (O.S.)

May I help you?

SOOKIE

Yes, hello, my name is Sookie St. Clair -- I'm the chef at the Independence Inn.

REVIEWER (O.S.)

I know who you are.

SOOKIE

You do? Well, I'm flattered. You write about so many chefs and...

REVIEWER (O.S.)

What are you doing here?

SOOKIE

Right. Well, I know this is a terrible intrusion, but... are you cooking?

REVIEWER (O.S.)

I'm making chicken.

SOOKIE

(sniffing)

Tarragon? White wine? A little cream?

REVIEWER (O.S.)

Yes.

34 CONTINUED:

34

SOOKIE

You used too much salt.

REVIEWER (O.S.)

I did not.

SOOKIE

It smells salty.

REVIEWER (O.S.)

I'm closing the door now.

SOOKIE

Wait! I found out your name through my network of culinary friends and...

REVIEWER (O.S.)

Look, this is really inappropriate. And confusing. I gave you a good review. The magazine is already on the newsstands. There's nothing I can do. I suggest you go home.

He starts to shut the door. Sookie half-turns towards it.

SOOKIE

I don't care about the review. just want you to try this dish, (holds out the dish)

with this wine.

(holds out the wine)

I'll wait.

A hand appears and takes the dish and wine. Sookie smiles a little triumphant smile.

35 INT. LORELAI'S CAR - DAY (DAY 5) 35

Lorelai and Rory drive along in silence. Lorelai looks at Rory who just keeps staring straight ahead.

LORELAI

So, quite a day.

RORY

I don't want to talk. Please.

LORELAI

Okay.

(more)

35 CONTINUED:

35

LORELAI (cont'd)

(beat)

You know, I really think that we should...

RORY

Stop the car!

LORELAI

What?

RORY

Here, stop here!

Lorelai stops the car.

36 EXT. ROAD - CONTINUOUS - DAY (DAY 5)

36

Rory and Lorelai get out of the car. Rory starts off in the same direction the deer staggered off in.

LORELAI

Just felt like a impromptu nature walk?

RORY

I want to make sure it's alright.

LORELAI

What's alright?

RORY

The deer.

LORELAI

Rory, we're never going to find the deer.

RORY

I'm going to try.

LORELAI

I'm in heels.

RORY

Then stay in the car.

LORELAI

It's dangerous in the car with crazy kamikaze deer around.

GILMORE GIRLS "The Deer-Hunters Shooting Script - 8/18/00

37 CONTINUED:

LORELAI

Maybe you shouldn't have been studying that hard.

RORY

What are you talking about?

LORELAI

You're sixteen. You're supposed to sleep. And eat a real meal. And come up for air once in a while.

RORY

They kicked me out.

LORELAI

No. Of course not. They love you. This is all coming from me.

RORY

Are you telling me to quit?

LORELAI

I'm telling you that if you wanted to go back to your other school with Lane, I would be fine with that.

RORY

You don't think I can do it.

LORELAI

Okay, stop here. You look at me. Now, you know that's not true. I think you can do anything. No one thinks higher of you than I do. I plan to be you someday. But, you don't lose it in class. That's not in the Rory personality description. And if you're losing it in class because you're tired or stressed out or working too hard, I'm worried about that. I have to be.

RORY

I lost it once. Only once.

LORELAI

Okay. Fine.

They walk a beat.

37 CONTINUED: (2)

LORELAI (cont'd)

I can't even remember a time when we weren't talking about you going to Harvard. It's like it was always a given that it was going to happen. That's what we were working for. Everything went in that direction.

RORY

I know.

LORELAI

But, I'm forgetting how all that started.

RORY

What do you mean?

LORELAI

I mean, was it me that started it or was it you? Was it my dream that you went to Harvard?

RORY

Mom...

LORELAI

Because I never got to do the big fancy college thing. Maybe this whole time I was thinking it's all for Rory when it wasn't.

RORY

Yes, it was.

LORELAI

Maybe I've been pushing you too hard. Maybe I want you to have this because I didn't. Maybe I'm living through you.

RORY

Mom...

LORELAI

I don't want you to feel that you have to do this for me. I mean, maybe this is the wrong dream.

RORY

I'm not doing this because of you.

37 CONTINUED: (3)

37

LORELAI

If it is, you don't have to do it.

RORY

I know that.

LORELAI

I mean, I'll still love you even if you can't support me in my old age in the fabulous manner in which I plan on growing accustomed to.

RORY

I'll remember that selfless gesture. Thank you.

LORELAI

I just want you to be happy.

RORY

I am.

LORELAI

No, I mean really happy. Like dancing through the woods crazy kind of happy. And if Chilton and Harvard aren't going to make you dance through the woods, then forget about them.

RORY

I was just behind. I never caught up on all the reading. That's why I got a D.

(beat)

I can catch up. I will catch up. And once I do, everything will be fine.

LORELAI

Rory...

RORY

And Harvard is my dream. I want it more then anything. I swear.

LORELAI

Yes, but...

RORY

I appreciate what you're saying. I do, really. But I'm not ready to give up on Chilton.

37 CONTINUED: (5)

LORELAI

Yeah.

(beat)

I'm really hoping he has insurance.

The two women keep walking along the road in search of the deer.

38 INT. LORELAI'S HOUSE - LIVING ROOM - DAY (DAY 5)

38

37

Lorelai and Rory arrive home.

LORELAI

Okay, get that plaid skirt off, grab your books, we're going to Luke's.

RORY

Don't you have to get back to work?

LORELAI

They can last a little while longer without me. Plus, Michel's so cute when he feels like he's been overworked. His ears puff out, his nostrils flare, it's big fun. Go.

RORY

I'm gone.

Rory runs off. The PHONE RINGS. Lorelai lets the machine pick it up.

LORELAI (V.O.)

(on answering machine)

"It's us. we're not here, we have a life, get over it."

The PHONE BEEPS.

MAX (V.O.)

(on answering machine)

Hi. This message is for Rory.

It's Max Medina calling.

(more)

38 CONTINUED:

38

MAX (V.O.) (cont'd) I just wanted to say that I talked to Headmaster Charleston, or Il Duce as he's more affectionately known in the Gilmore household, and he's agreed to let you do some extra credit work to help make up for the missed test today. Now, I'm not sure what the extra credit work is yet, but it probably will be time consuming and extremely painful. It will, however, get you back up to where I think you rightly belong. Don't lose heart, Rory. Make this work. And if your mother's listening, Lorelai, it was a pleasure encountering you. I hope it happens again. Anyway, see you in class. Bye.

The phone machine stops. Lorelai smiles to herself, pleased with the message and the messenger, as we:

FADE OUT.
